A Message from the Region

Together, we shall ensure that Netball is stronger than ever when we're back up and running, and part of that is centred around ensuring the continuing good governance of our region's clubs. To help, England Netball have released some guidance on holding AGMs to ensure the smooth running of clubs at this time.

On behalf of the London & South East Netball Association, we continue to wish you all well and remember, you can always count on us for help or support at any time - Covid-19 or not.

CAPS

In light of the current and ongoing Coronavirus situation, England Netball has taken the decision to suspend the next CAPS assessment during June 2020.

This decision will mean that some clubs will be unable to submit their information in time to re-accredit in line with the CAPS accreditation timescales. England Netball has also taken the decision to extend the accreditation of all those clubs who were due to re-accredit from 1st March 2020 – 30th June 2020 by 6 months, and those clubs affected will be contacted by England Netball directly. If you are unsure of the expiry date of your CAPS accreditation, please don't hesitate to get in contact with the London & South East Regional office and we can happily advise you.

During this time, we know many clubs may take the opportunity to update areas of their CAPS accreditation in readiness for future assessment dates, hopefully in the autumn. Our network of Netball Development Officers are able to help and support you through this as fully as possible (contact details can be found at the bottom of this Newsletter). There are a small number of elements that are unable to be completed or updated at this point due to the suspension of all netball activity, these include;

- Coach and umpire courses and qualifications



Margaret was also responsible for developing netball at the University of Kent, where she was awarded Sportswoman of the Year in 1987 for her commitment to the sport. Margaret had an incredible impact on many, many women in the district who have been able to play local league Netball as a result of her vision to set up a league that is still going strong over 40 years later, and she will be sorely missed.
